OUR MISSION

We are using the power of generosity to serve people in need around the world.

In sub-Saharan Africa, we provide access to clean water to people in rural villages and uplift women with training on menstrual hygiene through our Generosity Women program. It all starts with clean water: improvement of health and hygiene, restoring lost time, increasing self-worth in women, and increasing school attendance because children are no longer missing school due to spending time fetching water or being sick due to drinking contaminated water. We can make a difference and create a ripple effect that will affect the lives of millions of people and ensure a sustainable future for current and future generations.



PARTNERSHIP WITH GRUNDFOS

In October, 2020, Generosity Global Association (A subsidiary of Generosity Global Inc.) was awarded a generous grant of **\$29,340 (16,300,000XHF)** from the Grundfos Foundation (Poul Due Jensen Foundation) to ensure clean water is made available to people living in the community of Bepanda, in the littoral region of Cameroon, as a response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

As partners, Generosity Global and Grundfos foundation worked together to build a complete water system in the Bepanda community, that would ensure approximately **10,000** people of the **35,000** people in the community had access to cleaning water. To implement the project, Generosity Global agreed to also use Grundfos solar powered water pumps. The project was not only focused on providing access to clean drinking water, but also had a core focus of creating awareness and educating the community on best practices on how to contain and prevent the spread of COVID-19.

PROVISION OF CLEAN DRINKING WATER

With a grant from the Grundfos Foundation, Generosity Global created a solar water point with a 10,000 liters reservoir that serves **10,000** people in the Bepanda Community. The hospital and college are the immediate beneficiaries of this initiative.

COVID-19 RESPONSE INCENTIVE

Regular hand washing is critical in fighting the spread of Covid-19. Generosity Global distributed



95 hand-washing buckets (each bucket holds **50** liters of water)
– A total of **4,750** liters of water



Ten (**10**) cartons of hand soap (each carton with **70** bars of soap)
– A total of **700** bar soaps



Ten (**10**) cartons of hand sanitizer (each carton with **20** individual hand sanitizers)
– A total of **200** hand sanitizers

The items listed above were distributed equally among the Health Center, college, and the community.

Economic Empowerment

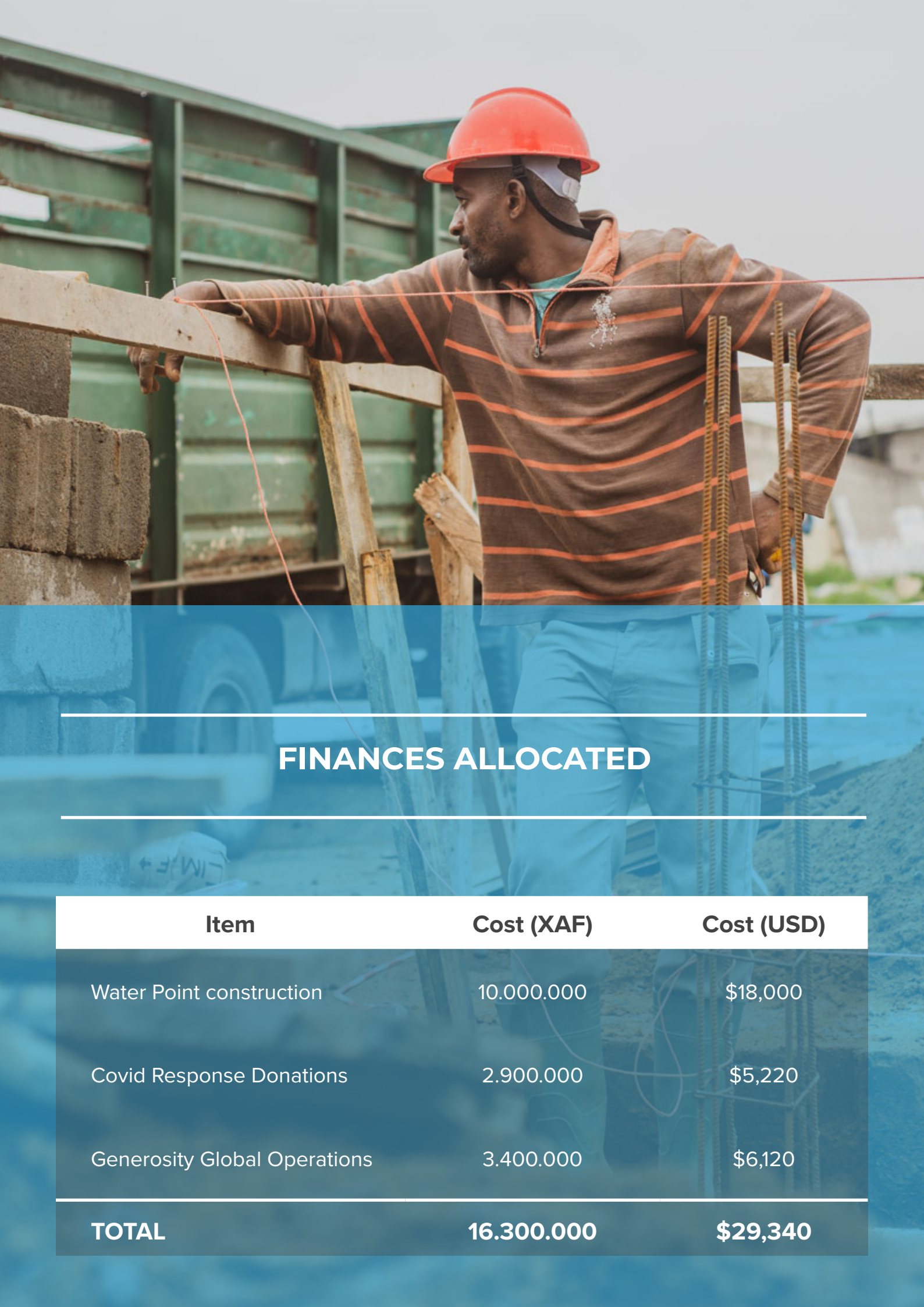
Use of local labor force (2 bricklayers) to construct the foundation of the water tower. Worked with local bore hole drilling contractors to complete drilling.

COMMUNITY BUILDING & PARTNERSHIP



Generosity Global established a solid relationship with the local Council alongside the chiefs of this region. This collaboration allowed a new generation of community leaders to join the **Water Management Committee (WMC)**, which works with Generosity Global and the Council to ensure the project's long-term viability.






The Local Council has a department that manages water projects in this Community; Generosity global is part of that community and brings experience from previous projects, which adds value and helps make projects more sustainable.
